#### **MAST YEAR**


## **ROB THE RAINMAN**

#### RAINFALL REPORT


September's total was 66.8mm at just about the expected (10% above the average). It was a month of two halves. The low pressure systems that moved in during the last week of August continued throughout the first half of September, with all but 0.6mm of the total rainfall coming in that period.

Notable days were the 7th with 19.8mm, courtesy of lively thundery showers, and the 14th with 10.8mm.

From the 17th high pressure won the battle and returned and it was essentially dry thereon in. Not wall to wall sunshine but a significant number of days were those lovely September days with really clear light giving great views from higher ground. Once the rain came in any quantity it was a spectacularly quick return to a green landscape once again. The spring and summer were special – ones to remember but I missed the green.

#### **PROGRESS!**

Kissing Gates replace stiles: Almost three years ago Julia Askew (the then Chair) won a Lottery Grant to replace stiles along the footpath from Aston Bank to Mill Lane. Following a Review of progress by Maggie Pettit (current Chair) Aug '24, three more gates were ordered and provided free of charge by Stephen Organ at Hereford Council. Unavoidable delays in fitting have included, delivery, ground too soft, ground too hard, & haymaking, but thanks to the skills of Dave Aubrey all of the Kissing gates have now been fitted and look amazing. Parishioners using this path will no longer have to climb and lift dogs over stiles and will generally find it much easier to walk the path and perhaps use it to access cricket and tennis facilities.



**Road run off on to B4222:** As you know this is another longstanding issue and we're keeping our fingers crossed that our application for a Drainage Grant to Herefordshire Council will be granted. Specialist technicians have assisted us in scoping the Project; we've had several positive meetings with the Floodrisk Team at Herefordshire Council. If granted we will then need to consult other stakeholders before work can commence.**Road Improvements in the Parish:** Highways have notified us that from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> November they will undertake 'Improvement works on the B4222 from Kingsmill to C1281. This is a significant stretch of road. Further information will appear on the Parish Council website. **Maggie Pettit (Chair)**

#### Meeting 24th September 2015

The September meeting was attended by six Councillors and the Clerk to the Council. No members of the public attended.

Brian Jones, Chairman over many years, has stepped down. Councillors expressed gratitude for all his hard work and contribution to The Lea. Brian quietly and steadfastly dealt with the bureaucracy involved in his dealings with all external agencies. He has a wealth of knowledge regarding the village and local and county issues. Brian will continue as a Councillor.

A new Chair was elected, Councillor Martin Richards, proposed by Councillor Nicholls, seconded by Councillor Williams, he was welcomed into his new position and assured ongoing support with parish concerns.

Tributes were made to a previous Councillor, Clive Tree, who had made a significant contribution to The Lea during his tenure.

Councillors had been asked by the village PCSO, Claire Denton for priorities for policing. Speeding, and parking on pavements were put forward. Councillor Bramer's Ward Councillor's report is available on the parish website.

#### **BLEED KITS IN LEA**

Following a presentation to the Lea Parish Council by a resident at the July Parish Council meeting, there was agreement to fund two Bleed Kits. These have now been installed in the village — one in the bus shelter opposite The Crown and the other at Lea Village Hall.

The village PCSO, Claire Denton was present at this meeting and also supported installing these kits, which are currently carried by first responders. The majority of severe to catastrophic bleeds occur accidentally: work injuries, farms, road traffic accidents, groundworks, and homes, intentional stabbing being relatively rare.

The founder of the Daniel Baird Foundation, Dr Lynn Baird sent an e-mail of thanks to the Lea Parish Council. Apparently there are still few of these kits available for use in Herefordshire.

In rural areas there may be a delay in help arriving. The two kits in Lea are registered with ambulance control who can, in cases of severe to catastrophic bleed, direct people to their location. Any competent person can use the kit. Further details are available on the Daniel Baird Foundation webpage:



#### THE LINTON POUND- AUTUMN UPDATE

Readers of *The Chimes* will be aware that the Linton Pound was recently demolished at the behest of Herefordshire Council. Having been given two days to secure the pound followed by a stay of execution of a further few days it was an additional three weeks or so before a demolition team, without advance warning, undertook the task. The council had indicated that the stone could be retained for the construction of an historical garden on the same site and that in order to facilitate this only the minimum needed to make the site safe would be removed. Furthermore, the Conservation Officer would be in attendance to oversee the demolition.

In the event the whole of the pound was removed, no one from Herefordshire Council turned up and very little of the building stone was retained locally. Herefordshire Council was contacted with a request that the stone be returned to Linton.

The response was that it had been taken to a location in Staunton, Gloucestershire utilising a licensing scheme. Further enquiries at the place where the stone was deposited elicited the response that it had already been used as hardcore for a building project and was not traceable. Further clarification is being sought from Herefordshire Council and this may be the subject of a Freedom of Information request.

It is our intention, nevertheless, to prepare a plan for the re-use of the site utilising the remaining stone. As a first step, the parish council in Arlingham has been contacted to find out how they had saved their pound, which had been in a similar state of disrepair to the Linton monument. In addition a local architect with expertise in heritage work has been contacted to see if he can help us with our plans. 



## **RECTOR'S LETTER**

**November 1st All Saints Day** 

Many people have a false idea about what a saint is. They think saints are people who never committed a sin in their entire lives, people who were always shining with virtue. But this is a fallacy. It implies that the saints were saints from the cradle onwards. In other words, they were born saints. We shouldn't draw a rigid line between saints and sinners. There is something of the sinner in every saint and something of the saint in every sinner. It has been said that saints are sinners who go on trying.

The saints were made of the same flawed material as us. They faced the same temptations as we do. They did not have things easier than us. They just struggled harder. They were not born saints; they became saints through the choices they made. Every saint underwent a conversion. We see this in the lives of some greatest names in the churches list of saints: Saint Francis of Assisi; Ignatius of Loyola; Augustine of Hippo; Paul of Tarsus...Each of these at a certain moment in their lives heard and obeyed the words of Christ, 'repent and believe the good news.'

All the saints were converted from darkness to light, from selfishness to generosity, from sin to virtue, a conversion is not something that could be achieved overnight rather it is the result of a long and painful struggle. This is why the saints, even the little ones, are such a challenge to us. We cannot think about them without experiencing a call to conversion, a call to rethink our basic attitude to life, to redefine our goals, to confront our sinfulness, and our need to open ourselves to God's love and mercy. The saints show us what we could be if we were willing to take the risk of total surrender to the love of God.

The saints serve as models for us precisely because they were sinners like us. But they were not overwhelmed by their sins or crippled by their feelings of guilt and shame. They rejoiced in God's forgiveness, and with the help of God's grace succeeding in putting their sins behind them. In them we see the triumph of grace over every weakness and sinfulness.

Today people can't relate to the plastic saints of perfectionism. We have to respect the dark side of human nature. To deny is to drive it underground where it works hiddenly. Today we extol people who have tried to live fully rather than those who have withdrawn from life.

Today's feast is a celebration of the capabilities of human beings, and of what God's grace can achieve when human cooperation is forthcoming. It is good to be reminded that human beings have such a side, especially in these days when it seems that only the most brutish side of human beings is displayed in the newspapers and on television. Holiness has been described as loveliness of spirit. In each saint we get a glimpse of our capabilities, our failings, and our need of grace and unconditional love. Cardinal Newman said, 'The lives of the saints is the only true evidence for the existence of God.'
