RAINFALL REPORT

March's total was 123.6mm which was about 140% more than the average so, er, a somewhat wet month yet again. This was more than last year but that very wet March followed a very dry February whereas this year it followed a very wet February. So the rain just kept coming except that on the 1st it was as the white stuff as we had a fall of wet snow of a couple of lying centimetres or so which gave 16.8mm. And this early part of the month was also chilly with a couple of overnight frosts and a

chilly north to north-easterly wind. But of course astronomically it was still winter as the vernal equinox (the day and night length being the same) wasn't until the 20th of the month (this year, it varies) which used to be the first day of spring (the meteorological 3 monthly seasons are based on the annual temperature cycle). Mind you, the 1st or the 20th the weather was still lousy. From the 8th all but 5 days had some rain recorded and for the 3 days of the 26 to the 28th we had 42.3mm (24.1mm alone on the 27th). Over that time I noted just 3 nice sunny days and one of those was Easter Saturday but both Good Friday and Easter Sunday were dull and the latter came with a chilly wind. It's all beginning to feel a bit biblical!

RECTOR'S LETTER

Have you ever wondered how your local church is funded? Our churches have four main sources of income; regular giving from churchgoers, fees from weddings and funerals, fundraising and grants from other charities, and investments and income from other assets. To this we can now add grants from local civic parish councils.

Historically, there used to be a church rate, which was enforceable in law, that church parish council could ask people to pay. In 1884 the Local Government Act was passed, creating a secular version of the parish council, with powers to raise rates for the work of the new civic council. It was entirely appropriate that the new parish council was not given powers or control of church buildings or charities.

But the question long remained whether civic parish councils were empowered, if they chose, to make grants to churches and church charities for their activities within the local community. Some parish councils did but others were advised not to the situation has been unclear for a long time. Not everybody goes to church, it was argued but, equally not everyone is a member of the cricket club, which can receive money from the local council.

There has been a long discussion between the Church and the Government about whether or not this discriminates against the Church, as Churchgoers pay their council tax like everyone else.

The wonderful news for parish churches, is that from 26 December 2023, the law has been changed by the Government expressly to enable parish councils to make grants towards churches.

The NALC has now withdrawn its advice, LO1-18, Financial Assistance to the Church and has issued a new document, LO2-23, Power to fund works to property relating to the of the Church or Church held ecclesiastical charity, in which its former advice on funding for the Church-or Church charities has been replaced.

Our priceless church buildings are part of everyone's heritage, local and national, and our church members play a huge part in conserving and repairing them. It is for everyone's benefit if both the old stones and the living stones are able to prosper, for the sake of the wider parish and community.

LEA PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

THE LEA PARISH COUNCIL

The parish council meeting held on Wednesday 3rd April at Lea Village Hall had a long agenda, but the matters on hand were mostly a bit technical. All councillors were present, supported by the Clerk, and with two local residents and the Village Lengthsman in attendance.

Speed Indicator Device (SID): The parish council has confirmed that it will purchase one SID for use within the village. It has been decided that a total of three concrete bases will be provided, which will enable the SID to be moved around, should that be considered appropriate.

Lengthsman Scheme: at the meeting the Lengthsman provided a report on work done during the past year, and it was agreed that he should continue for the 2024/25 budget year. Without going into details, many of which are sketchy at the moment, Herefordshire Council is taking over management of the Lengthsman Scheme. There is the potential for additional funding in relation to routine Lengthsman duties, for Public Rights of Way work, and for additional drainage work.

Traffic Speed: For some time, it has been recognised that it is inappropriate for Mill Lane and Rock Lane to be subject to a 60mph speed limit and a request for a Traffic Regulation Order to reduce the authorised speed down to 30mph is being made. This will be a long-winded process unfortunately.

Annual Parish Meeting: Every English parish must hold an annual Parish Meeting. It consists of the local government electors within the parish and is normally chaired by chairman of the parish council. (Note: the meeting is entirely separate from the parish council). This year the Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Wednesday 15th May at Lea Village Hall at 7pm. At the time of writing, Ben Savidge is hoping to attend to provide an update on the ongoing work to get the Crown Inn up and running again. An agenda for the meeting will be published early in May.

The next Lea Parish Council meeting is due is be held on Wednesday 9th May.






MAY HILL IN THE SPRINGTIME

May Hill is a familiar sight in this part of Herefordshire. It is an almost circular hill of some 971 feet (296 metres) in height, crowned with a stand of pine trees. The trees were planted in 1887 to mark the Golden Jubilee of Queen Victoria. It is said that from its summit one can see 12 counties. Certainly the Black Mountains, the Malverns, the Forest of Dean, the Severn Vale and Herefordshire's wide acres are clearly visible. Some of the land is owned by the National Trust although Longhope Parish Council owns the summit through the May Hill Trust. The hill is designated as a 'Marilyn' - a name used for prominences of over 250 metres or 492 feet.

In the springtime the hill is stained blue by millions of bluebells and in the summer months flowering heathers bring very different hues to the landscape. There is circular walk of some three miles (approximately 4.8 km). It is a good place for dog walkers too, though because of the livestock in the area (it is grazed by pigs and ponies and sheep) a lead would be essential. The car park adjacent to May Hill Common is a good starting point for the walk. The route is a bit steep in places and parts can be muddy in wet weather and there are two stiles to negotiate so robust footwear would be wise.

It is a place of great beauty that was celebrated by the Dymock Poets. Edward Thomas wrote of the scene in these words:

'Again and again we saw...the complete broad dome of a hill six miles distant, a beautiful hill itself, but especially seen thus, always unexpectedly, through gaps in this narrow country, as through a window'



LINTON SUPPORTS THE "GREAT HEREFORDSHIRE CLEAN UP"

Did you know that more than two million pieces of litter are dropped in the UK daily? Fast food-related packaging, plastic bottles and drink cans have all contributed to the UK's worsening litter crisis. Over £1 million is spent each year in Herefordshire alone cleaning up litter. This staggering figure illustrates the scale of the problem with most of the litter dropped from passing vehicles. Litter encourages rats and poses a threat to public health and to our native wildlife. This year's "*Great Herefordshire Clean Up*" ran between 17th March and 2nd April. It was part of a highly successful UK-wide campaign organised by Keep Britain Tidy. Volunteers pledged nationally to collect over 400,000 sacks of litter. The hedgerows and roadside verges in the Linton area yielded 10 sacks of litter. Most of the litter was found in Revells Lane but disappointingly no lane is considered litter free.



LINTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

(Covering Bromsash, Gorsley & Linton)

LINTON(S) PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The Parish Council is pursuing with Herefordshire Council the introduction of Quiet Lanes in the Parish. Quiet Lanes are nationally recognised designations of single-track roads where visitors and locals can enjoy the natural surroundings and use them for activities such as cycling, horse-riding, jogging and walking. The two options being considered are a core route covering the minimum required, and an extended route covering the full requirement. The aim of the core route is to provide a route between the main settlements in the Parish along Quiet Lanes (i.e. Bromsash, Linton, Gorsley and Aston Crews); it provides a link to the school, the bus stop in Gorsley and the community shop. The extended route includes all the approaches to Linton (thus providing a route to the bus stops at Hilltop and Jays Green) as well as extending the Quiet Lanes to include the areas of population in Gorsley, and Pound Farm Lane.

The training of volunteers for a Community Speed Watch Scheme on the B4221 in Gorsley begins on 29 April. Although not enforcement, Community Speed Watch is a community-operated feedback scheme designed to allow unpaid volunteers to officially monitor and report to the Police the details of speeding vehicles in specific areas where speeding is of concern to the community.

Herefordshire Council have begun formal consultation on their Draft Local Plan and Local Transport Plan, with a deadline of 20 May for comments. The Local Plan, once ratified, will supersede Neighbourhood Development Plans where these do not comply. More details to follow as the Parish Council forms its response, but the Plan's core principle that housing development will be based on current infrastructure will constrain further building in the parish.

SUSTAINABILITY AND RECYCLING CAFÉ

 take some spare seeds, plants or produce and stop them going to waste.

HEDGEHOG RUNS

Hedgehog numbers have declined in England, Wales and Scotland from 30 million in the 1950s to less than one million. Reasons for this include loss of habitat, use of pesticides and traffic. One way to help hedgehogs is to make sure they can travel safely to forage for food and meet mates. Fences and walls need a 13cm square gap at the bottom to help them roam. If you would like a free Hedgehogs R Us Highway Surround for your fence or boundary please collect one at the café. We also have some free leaflets with ten suggestions on how you can help hedgehogs.



Five councillors, 13 members of the public and a clerk from HALC attended the Parish Council meeting on April 2nd. During the closed section the councillors appointed the new clerk, Andree Mitchell who joined the meeting after her appointment was confirmed. Vicky Eldridge was co-opted onto the council. There is more than £20,000 in the bank accounts which will rise to more than £30,000 once the precept is received. An update on the traffic calming confirmed that a second phase which will include the white gates is planned. The hedge replacement application by Chicory Crops was supported. It was agreed to extend the lengthsman's contract for two months and to put it out to tender to ensure value for money for parishioners. New steps have been installed on the footpath at Wobage. In his closing remarks the chairman thanked Helen Tinson for her support clerking the meetings.

The next Council AGM meeting is at 7pm on Tuesday 7th May.
