ROB THE RAINMAN



February's total was 113.9mm which was about 125% more than the average so, er, a somewhat wet month then. The month did start with a dry and quite mild period before significant rainfall of 46.5mm over the 6th to the 8th followed by 29.8mm over the 13th to the 17th. The 11th was noted down as a "lovely day" but that was the only one I made note of. Another slug of 23.3mm from the 20th to the 22nd and then dry again until the month bowed out with 13.6mm on the 28th and the extra day. The saturated ground meant that even when dry it still felt "wet" as the lanes were continually running with water and walks were mud experiences. Plus it was quite a dull month but overall it was largely mild with a few cooler days and just a couple of light overnight frosts on the 23rd and 24th

But somewhat different to last February when the total rainfall was just 6.9mm. The total rainfall for the winter was 285.9mm which was about 43% more than the average. So after two relatively dry winters we were back to a wet one with all the associated problems that caused. A few cold snaps and overnight frosts but otherwise mild and no snow. But plenty of windy days, in fact very much a named storm winter but luckily for us only Henk (rain) and Isha (wind strength) caused any really serious

FLOOD GROUP

Gloucestershire Natural Flood Management (NFM) update

Leaky Dams were constructed by specialist contractors along a length of stream from Woodfield Farm. Leaky dams, using existing trees and brash when placed in a stream, have the capacity to slow the flow increasingly over time. In addition, several Hazel Faggots were installed, again in the base of the stream towards the top end. These are strips of hazel wood trapped in a framework of four posts which perform a similar job to leaky dams.

We are grateful to Pete Belk, Glos NFM Manager, Mr and Mrs Phelps and Mr Stevens on whose land these NFM structures were placed.

ANDEL & CHESTER UNIVERSITY

Work continues on the water flow sensors which will eventually provide us with Flood Alerts and we await another visit. A meeting with the university is being arranged for mid-March to identify the work for Year 3 of the Project. More details to follow.

RECTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT

The Bishop of Hereford designated the year 2023 as a year of prayer across the Diocese. There were many events and services designed to encourage people to pray. Taking up the challenge in our own benefice, we had a day of prayer and reflection at Upton Bishop Church, which was very well attended and enjoyed by those who took part. We have also developed a benefice prayer diary and a benefice prayer.

Looking back over the past year, we have achieved a lot. Our work with young people in schools has developed and I would like to thank all those who take part in Open the Book. The number of children attending our church schools continued to grow. The junior church at Lea has held some wonderful events over the year, the last being a very successful pancake day on Shrove Tuesday, many thanks to Alice and to Iris for all the hard work. Safeguarding is an important aspect of our work with children and vulnerable adults, and I would like to thank Charlotte Newton for taking on the role of safeguarding lead.

I would like to thank everyone for their continuing generosity towards the church in this time of financial challenge. Our levels of parish giving have remained high, and we have managed to pay our parish offer in full. The church treasurers have worked really hard to put us in a strong financial position. Overall planned giving across the diocese has increased from £10.33 per person per week to £10.75 per person per week. However, this is still the lowest in the Church of England where the national average is £18.78 per week. 120 churches in Hereford have set up contactless giving. 70% of churches have signed up to the parish giving scheme.

Some churches in Herefordshire have had to cut services and limit their activities, due to a lack of financial support. All our six churches have managed to continue having regular services and have undertaken a wide range of activities in the local community. This is mainly due to the help of the retired clergy and our local ministry team. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Nick, the latest member of the team. Our six church buildings are very well cared for and looked after by those who attend church. Aston Ingham Church carried out major repairs to the roof and other repairs this year. I would like to thank Allison and James for all their hard work. We also have plans to develop Upton Bishop Church, Linton Church and Lea Church. Thanks to the generosity of people in the local community major developments are going to take place in the near future. Weston under Penyard church has improved its disability access and is in the process of introducing a new, greener heating system. Hope Mansell Church has been in the news recently, because of the award-winning film documentary about the community. Repairs have been carried out on the pathway into church. We are very grateful to all those in the community who support our churches and care about them. Thanks to VOLT for their support at Linton. We continue to support the local community through the food banks in Ross and Newent. We also provided a warm space in Weston during the winter. We have regular coffee warnings at Lea and Upton Bishop which provide a warm safe place for people to come and have a chat.

LEA PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council meeting held on Wednesday 6th March at Lea Village Hall. All councillors were present, supported by the Clerk, with one local resident in attendance. The following issues were discussed:

Collapsed Access Cover on A40

Of significant concern is traffic control around the collapsed access cover outside the filling station. An investigation by the Locality Steward established that the cover gives access to a surface water removal facility and not a sewer. Thus, it is a Herefordshire Council asset and the authority is currently establishing how best to deal with the problem. The plan is to seek to ensure that the structure under the access cover is fully restored to avoid a repeat of the problems experienced over the past few years.

Walkers are Welcome Project

Lea is benefitting from the good work and generosity of 'Walkers are Welcome' (WaW), who are supported by grant from DEFRA and the Wye Valley AONB. Four self-closing gates are replacing four stiles to create an attractive walking route within the village. These are all on land at Moor Farm and enable WaW to publish a stile-free walking route in the village.

During research for the project, a footpaths inspector found that a concrete stile next to the former railway line is in the 'wrong' place by some 60m, due to errors in a 1950s map. The current route uses the concrete stile and always has done. The official, legal, route has never been used. The Parish Council is seeking to get the error corrected – but this is anticipated to be a lengthy process.

Street Watch is now active in The Lea. Local resident John Roberts, in his capacity as a Street Watch volunteer, completed a tour round the village with a PCSO, visiting the shop and garage and spoke to several people, one of whom expressed an interest in joining up as a volunteer.

Speed Check

Recently the West Mercia Police undertook a traffic speed check in the village, reporting a maximum speed of 31mph within the 30mph area

Annual Parish Meeting

Every English parish must hold an Annual Parish Meeting, consisting of the local government electors within the parish and normally chaired by the chairman of the Parish Council (note: the meeting is entirely separate from the Parish Council). This year the Annual Parish Meeting will be held on **Wednesday 15th May at Lea Village Hall at 7pm**. An agenda for the meeting will be published early in May.

The next Lea Parish Council meeting is due is be held on **Wednesday 3rd April**. The Parish Council plans to obtain at least one Speed Indicator Device (SID) for use within the village. Continued on page 26

It is intended to provide two or three bases at locations agreed with Herefordshire Council. An appropriate SID has been selected and is due to be purchased as soon as the bases are ready.

Flooding

The recent heavy rainfall has gone a long way towards proving the effectiveness of the Lea Flood Alleviation Scheme. There are known to have been minor road flooding issues and very soggy fields, but nothing more in the village. More information will be released in due course by Herefordshire Council about how any eligible flood-hit property owners can apply for up to £5000 to help make homes and businesses more resilient to future flooding.

Alma Inn Secures Rural Enterprise Funding To Expand its Kitchen







It has been nine years since Dan and I took over the reins at The Alma Inn in Linton; We have already had quite a journey, successfully introducing food to a traditionally wet-led pub, learning how to host Linton Festival and Summer Sessions, getting through a pandemic with numerous lockdowns and coming out the other end! We couldn't have done all this without the unfailing support of our regular customers who have been with us throughout.

We are lucky enough to run a thriving, CAMRA award-winning village pub with a strong community spirit. The pub aims to offer a warm welcoming environment in which to enjoy a tip-top pint and a drink and chat with friends, or a meal with your family. However, over the last year or so we have found that the demand for food has out-grown what we were able to achieve within our little kitchen! We were in great need of a bigger kitchen hence we started to explore the possibility of knocking through into an old derelict storage area to create a modern kitchen, double the size of the previous space!

We came across Herefordshire Council's Rural Enterprise Fund, a capital grant scheme funded by the UK Rural England Shared Prosperity Fund and part of the wider Levelling Up agenda. The aims of this scheme include to support rural businesses to develop products and facilities that will be of wider benefit to the local economy. The Herefordshire Council Rural Enterprise Fund contributed £47.615 towards an overall project costing of £95,231.



Alma Inn Secures Rural Enterprise Funding To Expand its Kitchen



After seven months of planning and construction, this project has now been completed. The kitchen reopened on Wednesday 13th March. The pub can now cater for more customers who wish to eat with us and enjoy a pint or two, or maybe take away a fish and chips meal to enjoy at home. The grant has also enabled us to invest in new equipment, including a pizza oven, which we hope will attract more customers, including families, to the pub, as well as offering another good take-away option for local people, especially in the summer months, when customers can make the most of the grounds to the rear of the pub. The increased business will allow us to continue to invest in our existing staff as well as recruit new staff to help out as the business grows. And as our business grows we look forward to supporting many of the fantastic strong rural businesses on our doorstep, within the food, drink and hospitality sector.

We hope you will be able to join us soon to enjoy a meal from the new kitchen, complemented by a pint of something nice to drink!

THE GREAT COLLABORATION-LOCAL ACTION FOR SUSTAINABILITY

At the Sustainability Café held in Linton Village Hall on the 9th March, we introduced 'The Great Collaboration". This was originally devised in Fownhope to help capture what the parishioners were doing to reduce carbon and improve sustainability. It has now been rolled out nationally and is a toolkit to allow councils - both parish and county - to see what people are doing or not doing in their area. This data is anonymous but provides insight as to what is happening locally on a parish-by-parish basis.

By registering with 'The Great Collaboration" and committing to carbon reduction, you'll be having your say in how local environmental policy is formed to meet the specific circumstances of residents where you live. By using the Toolkit, your local councils will be able to see what is already being done in your community, what people are planning to do, and what's holding them back from taking certain actions. They can use this information to inform their planning and decision making, to come up with support that is relevant to what's actually happening in your area. LINTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS (Covering Bromsash, Gorsley & Linton)


The Linton Parish Council has contacted South Herefordshire MP Jesse Norman's Office to alert them to the need for urgent action to address the speed of traffic on the B4221 through Gorsley which is increasingly dangerous and life-threatening. The Council also provided a portfolio of information and various proposals to improve the situation, plus a strongly supported petition of 725 signatures. Mr Norman's Office responded very positively, recognising the severity of the issue, and it is hoped that this will lead to the action that is required. Herefordshire Council is conducting an assessment to determine where a Speed Indicator Device would be best placed on the road to gather information, and a Community Watch Scheme is being organised.

The dangerous situation at Cut Throat Corner has been reported to the Locality Steward. On the left hand bend the road and railing have been damaged by heavy traffic leaving a dangerous unguarded drop from the road into a watercourse. This defect occurred in October 2020. At that time, some barriers were placed at the location, but these have now fallen into the watercourse. The Locality Steward raised a category 2A defect (28-day response time) which is the highest he could raise it without it being an emergency. Some temporary protection has been put in place, but a permanent solution is required.




