ROB THE RAINMAN

RAINFALL REPORT

November's total was 121.2mm, 70% more than average. Mild but overall dull for the first couple of weeks with significant rainfall on the 11th (22.9mm) and a very wet spell of 47.4mm on the 13th and 14th as a result of Spanish-named storm Claudia. It was cooler with a bit more in the way of sunshine after this. Frosty starts on the 20th and 21st and again on the 26th. December's total was 101.4mm, so again quite a wet month at 40% more than average. 11.6mm on the 1st saw the month in with 24.8mm on the 5th. Our own storm Bram on the 8th and 9th was for us just quite windy with 13.6mm of rain. The wet weather continued (12.1mm on the 18th) until the 21st, but it was also noticeably colder and quite breezy with a north to north easterly wind. Some sunshine but mostly dull, including Christmas, but New Years Eve was a lovely winter's day after a frosty start.

So 2025: certainly it will be remembered for the very dry and sunny spring and summer, this being accompanied by a number of heatwaves, and for the new records set. Overall rainfall was only down 20% on the yearly average, but a big seasonal variation with spring and summer down 75% on the average whilst autumn and winter was up 25% more than the average

By the time you read this article, the Parish Council will have met towards the end of January, having taken a Christmas break in December. Although it may seem very belated, we would like to wish you all a Very Happy and Healthy New Year.

SID (SPEED INDICATOR DEVICE) SHOULD BE BACK IN PLACE BY NOW

Due to some faulty components, SID has been back and forth to the manufacturers and is being returned in full working order. We can now look forward to collecting, analysing and publishing data in earnest. Thanks to Chris Yates, who has been liaising with the manufacturer.

DRAINAGE GRANT SUCCESS

Our application to Herefordshire Council has been successful to the tune of approximately £21K. This will enable us to tackle some very longstanding run-off from Aston Court Farm, and a second project in Aston Crews. The Parish Council are now liaising with the landowner to secure permission to commence the work. The drainage work in Aston Crews is likely to be completed shortly. Thanks to John Whatley and Terry Griffiths, our Lengthsman.

ROAD RESURFACING ALONG THE B4222

The Parish Council would like to thank parishioners for their patience in what was a lengthy resurfacing operation in November. Both the Resurfacing Team and the Traffic Management Team engaged daily at 8am with the parish council and responded extremely positively to parishioner concerns, allowing general access where possible and access to the Village Hall for some important gatherings in the duration. Thanks to Tania Clayton for daily liaison with Maggie Pettit and for keeping the Parish Council website up to date.

ANNUAL BUDGET PREPARATION

The budget will be finalised and published on the website following the January meeting. The Council look forward to discussing the Projects for the coming year, which will further support improvements in the Parish.



LEA PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

THE LEA PARISH COUNCIL

The agenda and full minutes of Parish Council meetings are available on the Lea Parish Council website www.theleaparishcouncil.gov.uk
Anyone in the parish can contact the council by e-mailing clerk@leaparishcouncil.gov.uk

The meeting on 26th November 2025 was attended by 6 Councillors, the Clerk to the Council and five members of the public.

The new Chair, Martin Richards, welcomed members of the public. The Council heard a synopsis of a recent planning application, with members of the public having the opportunity to question/discuss any issues. After consideration, the Parish Council resolved to support the Planning Application 252870 — Land at Line House.

Open Session/Views of Residents: Members of the public acknowledged the new Chair had attended the Coffee Morning in the Lea Village Hall and requested the Council do more to raise its profile in the village. Martin had been surprised that some residents were unaware of the Parish Council's work. Discussions will continue on raising the profile within the village.

A written submission to the Clerk expressed concerns that the new road surface on the A40 will have the same issues with leaves/plants growing in the edges and blocking drains. Martin has been meeting with the new Lengthsman and Locality Steward and these issues will be addressed as needed. At the time of writing Balfour Beaty are responsible as most issues occur on A and B roads in the village.

Residents expressed concerns about the junction of the B4224 /A40. Members of the council have daily experience of this junction where traffic does not stop/give way/look left. There are blind entrances/exits on the A40 plus the school entrance. Councillors expressed the view that "it was only a matter of time" before the recent "near misses" become a serious accident. Martin has agreed to follow this through with relevant authorities.

The minutes of the Ordinary meeting of 24th September 2025 were accepted. Finance statements and bank balances were accepted.

The Tree Warden scheme is to be considered in future meetings when more is known of the roles/responsibility.

The Parish Council agreed to adopt the IT Policy from Herefordshire Council. There were no reports available from the PCSO or Ward Councillor Bramer. (This has since been received and is on the webpage).

Items taken forward to the meeting on 28th January 2026 at 19.00 in Lea Village Hall were: a) Tree Warden Scheme b) Thoughts on land purchase c) Bleed/Defibrillator Training d) Feedback regarding B4224/A40.

There is no meeting in February, but the next meeting of the Parish Council is on Wednesday 25th March. Please come along or submit any questions/queries via the Clerk. Meet the new Chair and become involved in the village management.

ASTON INGHAM VILLAGE HALL APPEAL

The Aston Ingham Village Hall: At the Heart of Our Community for almost 100 years

For generations, the Aston Ingham village hall has stood at the centre of our community. More than just a building, it is a place where neighbours meet, friendships are formed, and village traditions are celebrated. From lively social events to quieter gatherings, the hall has played a vital role in bringing people together and continues to do so today.

A Brief History

The village hall was built by Messrs Longford & Sons for the princely sum of £460 originally opened for the Aston Ingham Women's Institute on 16th May 1927 to support the need for a shared space for meetings, events, and celebrations. Over the years, the hall has adapted to changing needs, hosting everything from wartime dances to modern-day clubs and activities. While its purpose has remained the same — to serve the community — the way it is used has naturally evolved with each generation. The timeline below shows some of world events that the Hall has seen.


LINTON POUND - UPDATE

It has previously been reported that a formal complaint has been raised with Herefordshire Council about the senseless demolition of the Linton Pound. The initial Council response did not answer the facts and so the complaint has been escalated further under advice from the Campaign to Protect Rural England and Open Spaces.

Ultimately, we reserve the right for all aspects of the demolition to be independently scrutinised by the Local Government Ombudsman and to seek undisclosed information under the Freedom of Information Act. In the meantime, the enquiries made with DEFRA and the Herefordshire Commons Registration Office have thus far proved fruitless. Whilst the pound site was in the care of Linton Parish Council and its precursor body, the Vestry Meeting, for generations, it was never registered as common land and therefore may not come within the remit of the Commons Act of 2006.

There are other areas of legislation that are relevant eg the Overseers Order of 1927 and these are being explored. Linton residents will be kept informed through these pages.

LINTON (SOUTH) PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The parish council will continue to focus in 2026 on efforts to improve road safety in the parish. The introduction of a 30mph speed limit on the B4221 following resurfacing work scheduled for later this year, has been approved by Herefordshire Council. Other speed calming measures initiated by the parish council include village gateways and a speed indicator device.

The council is also conscious of the threat to safety posed by speeding traffic on the B4224 in Bromsash. It manages a speed indicator device there but will consider other options at its meeting in January.

In addition, the council has installed several road safety signs at Shutton Crossroads in Linton.

The council has also resolved to promote and encourage community litter picking in the parish and will agree action at the meeting in January.





Any parishioner can contact the UBPC at clerk@uptonbishop.gov.uk Parish Council meeting minutes are available on the Parish Council website.

Five councillors, the clerk and nine members of the public attended the Parish Council meeting on December 2nd. Emily Misselbrook had registered an interest in becoming a Parish Councillor and was co-opted to fill the vacancy. She joined her fellow councillors after signing her declaration of acceptance of office. No issues were raised by the public. The ward councillor's report is on the website. Councillors supported the planning applications by Ayltor Barn and the Threshing Barn.

The lengthsman has concentrated on grips, gulleys and general maintenance across the Parish and has filled all the salt and grit bins.

The Council has £30,039 in the bank and all invoices were approved for payment. The 2025/26 budget process will be discussed at the next meeting. UB's Neighbourhood Development Plan is valid for two more years. Councillors will consider the plan, how it can be refreshed and associated funding in September 2026.

Herefordshire Council is reviewing broadband provision across the county. Parishioners are urged to make the clerk aware of areas in the Parish which do not have access to high-speed broadband so the information can be passed on to Herefordshire Council.

The next meeting is on **Tuesday February 3rd 2026**.

RECTOR'S LETTER



After the business of Christmas and the excitement of New Year, this time of year can sometimes feel a little dull – the weather often doesn't help, but more so than that, this is often a period where people can feel deflated. Dark mornings and early evenings (at least, until the clocks change), perhaps recovering from an expensive Christmas (for wallet, waistline, or both), and (as I experience every year) New Year's Resolutions gathering cobwebs in the corner, can often leave us with a sense that we're once again back into simply going through the motions of life.

People may think that life in the church can feel like this too sometimes – that there are times and seasons not only in nature, but in the ebb and flow of ministry, which leave us either very busy, or feeling that we seem to be doing the same sorts of things on repeat. The beginning of February is marked by what is very poetically and creatively (!) called "Short Ordinary Time" in the church calendar. Ordinary Time is marketed as exactly that – ordinary. It is not a season of preparation, nor one of celebration. It is simply the normal time between things – the gaps between the "Big Services" that people are more familiar.

In truth, there is no such thing as "Ordinary Time" – short, or otherwise. All of life, every day, is a gift and blessing which we receive from God. Our worship on Sundays, far from being simply repetitive and mundane, is the continual re-encountering of the Divine, right in front of us, in our presence. February also brings with it the start of Lent, the penitential six weeks where we prepare for Holy Week, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. I am very excited to let you know that this year we will be offering a Lent course over these six weeks, free of charge, and open to anyone and everyone.

Our course is called Bread of Life, and focuses on the Eucharist, or Holy Communion – what it means, what the church teaches happens at the service, and how our encounter with the bread and wine, the Body and Blood of Christ, shapes our lives and our faith. Details are still to be confirmed, but when they are there will be posters in all of the church noticeboards, and information on the Benefice website (www.ariconium.church). More information about the course itself can be found on its website (www.breadoflifecourse.co.uk).

So, as we battle through the rain and the mundane, take a moment to step back and look around you, and to realise that there really isn't anything "ordinary" in the lives which we lead, or the world in which we live. And please do consider signing up for our Lent course – David or I would be happy to speak to you further if you have any questions. God bless!
